

Voices, Inc. from New York will present two one-act plays at UCSD

November 6, 1972

VOICES, Inc., a dynamic Black theater troupe from New York, will present two one-act plays, "Malcolm" and "Martin," at the University of California, San Diego at 8:30 p.m., Tuesday, November 14, in the Revelle College Cafeteria.

Tickets are \$2 for general admission and \$1 for UCSD students with I.D. They are available from the Urey Hall Ticket Office on Revelle College or at the door the night of the performance.

The two plays will be presented within a single dramatic framework. VOICES utilizes musical sequences and spoken narrative to evoke experiences of Black people in America. Music, drama, dance, pantomime, and poetry are welded together in the productions.

"Martin" is a musical narrative/documentary on the life of the late Dr. Martin Luther King. In this new work, VOICES uses the spirituals of the southern experience, the gospels of the northern ghettos, and the stirring speeches of Dr. King to tell the story of a great Black American.

In "Malcolm" the hard rock and funky music of today tell the story of Malcolm X. His story, as interpreted by VOICES, reveals the compassion, strength, and beauty of a man which extend beyond the legend of hate and fear.

The entire company of VOICES, Inc. will be residing in the residence halls on the John Muir College campus November 13-15. During their stay, they will participate in workshops and discussions with students on campus.

VOICES, Inc. will also perform their production, "Journey Into Blackness," at California State University, San Diego, Wednesday, November 15.
