

Seminars in Librarianship scheduled

A series of Seminars in Librarianship has been scheduled at the San Diego campus of the University of California, it was announced today by University Librarian Melvin J. Voigt. The series will begin October 1.

The seminars will be held approximately once a month during the 1964-65 school year and will cover a variety of topics related to library management and operation.

Librarians from all San Diego libraries are invited to attend.

Donald Black, Systems Librarian at the UCLA Library, is scheduled to speak at the first seminar to be held at 4:00 p.m. Thursday, October 1, in room 2129, Building D. on the UCSD campus. Mr. Black will speak on the present status of data processing in library operation and the prospects for the next few years. A discussion period will follow his presentation.

Topics and speakers for future seminars will be announced later. Tentative arrangements have been made for seminars on library building and equipment planning, and on mechanization of university library circulation systems, Mr. Voigt said.
