

## A program of black cultural performing arts presented by The **Revolutionary Black Drama Association of UCSD**

## **November 12, 1973**

The Revolutionary Black Drama Association of the University of California, San Diego will present a program of black cultural performing arts at 8 p.m. Friday, Nov. 16, in room 2100 of the Basic Science Building, School of Medicine.

The program will be repeated at 8 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 17, in the Lincoln High School Auditorium.

Singing, poetry, dancing, skits and a minstrel show will be featured in the performances which are free and open to the public.

The show, called "Black Chess," looks at life as a chessboard with each individual having a position and a set of moves determined by his environment.

Caspar "Chip" Glenn, a Third College sophomore, and Michael Curry, a recent UCSD graduate, will provide music for the program which will be directed by Cheryl A. Garrett, a Muir College senior.

Some 70 students are active in the one-year-old drama association, which was founded to further understanding of black cultural arts.
