Re: CABRILLO STATUE

My dear Governor:

Enclosed find legislation passed at the last Session of the Legislature designating San Diego for the 400th Cabrillo Celebration.

My understanding is that Customs Duty was imposed on the statue and that you made representations same was for the State of California, the duty was waived and the statue today is in San Francisco in a private garage. The very act of waiving the duty in itself puts the jurisdiction of the statue in the name of the State, so I have been informed, and with the favorable action taken by the Legislature on my SCR #2, I ask you to give instruction to the State Park Commission of California to take possession, and further ask you to please carry out the wishes of the Legislature in this matter - all without expense to the State. The Santa Fe Railway have agreed to ship free of cost the statue from San Francisco to San Diego, and I understand the Navy as well.

Will you kindly write me a letter of acknowledgement, and with your permission I will cooperate with the State Park Commission in getting results. Anything that you can do will be gratefully appreciated.
