Dear Madam,

It is with feelings of sincere <sup>intelligence</sup> regret I have to communicate the melancholy ~~news~~ of the decease of your beloved brother Dr Haden's S. Painter who departed this life <sup>Monday</sup> ~~Monday~~ <sup>morning</sup> ~~Dec 29~~ of apoplexy. He had been complaining some months previously and took a journey to San Francisco for the benefit of his health. At the entrance of the harbor he was wrecked on board the <sup>Stranger</sup> Major Tompkins and received considerable injury from the effects of which together with rheumatism he never entirely recovered up to the time of his death. During his illness he received the best of medical attendance and every comfort his friends could bestow upon him. I knew your brother long and well even before he was left New York to come to California. During the past year or eighteen months he has been more or less my companion and when I left for the States last July he gave me a letter of introduction to you and to his wife. My time was so much taken up & forced it impossible to go to Clifton



otherwise I should have seen you but I called upon  
at his brother's house Francis of Spinola for whom I had  
a letter, ~~several~~ <sup>several times</sup> times. twice I knocked <sup>several times</sup> without  
gaining admittance and the last time I raged  
I persevered so long I should have thought the  
house uninhabited but that I saw a child  
through the basement window. I stepped across  
the street to the station house to enquire the  
meaning and was told that the persons in that  
house meaning Spinolas were a little hard of hear-  
ing and that if I wished to get in I must  
knock loud. I went again and redoubled  
my efforts after knocking at least ten min-  
utes the servant girl came to the door  
and seemed little inclined to give me the least  
satisfaction. She could not tell when I could  
find Mr Spinola at home either late at night  
or early in the morning - that the most like-  
ly place was at the Montague Hall. The  
family she said were all in the country  
I was at Montague Hall once but could  
see nothing of Mr S. I took considerable  
trouble to find Mr S to deliver the letter to  
him and to him personally at the particular  
request of your brother and through him I ex-  
pected an introduction to Mrs Painter  
to whom I was to give every information  
concerning her husband. I did not return

to San Diego till the 17th of the present  
month some days after your brother's death.  
What I have written concerning him is all the  
information I have been able to gain but  
should I hear of anything else or be able  
to learn how his affairs stood or if I  
can get any mementoes belonging to him  
I shall write again —
