

UCSD received two cash grants from Gulf Oil Foundation

Two cash grants, totaling \$13,500, have been received by the University of California, San Diego from the Gulf Oil Foundation.

UCSD's new Regional Energy Policy Study Center received \$12,500 and one thousand dollars was given to the Dr. Maria Goeppert Mayer Memorial Fund. Checks were presented to UCSD Chancellor William McElroy by Dr. John Howe, technical director-materials, Advanced Power Systems Group, and by Dr. William Whittemore, manager, TRIGA Reactor Facility, at Gulf General Atomic Company.

The Energy Policy Center is devoted to an assessment of area energy needs and the environmental impact of various energy sources, especially nuclear power plants.

The Mayer Fund, which memorializes the late Nobel Prize winner and UCSD faculty member, supports an annual physics colloquium that will bring some of the world's leading scientists to the campus to lecture.

The grants are part of the Gulf Aid to Education Program, under which funds are distributed annually to further the educational programs of worthy agencies, colleges, and universities in the United States and its territories.

In addition to special grants of the type presented to UCSD, other phases of Gulf's educational assistance program for students and institutions of higher education include undergraduate scholarships, employee gift matching, capital grants, departmental assistance grants, and graduate fellowships.
