

Dr. Henry Wheeler is PILS lecturer

Dr. Henry O. Wheeler, professor of medicine at the School of Medicine, University of California, San Diego, will present the third lecture in this season's Professors' Inaugural Lecture Series at 4:15 p.m. on Thursday, April 17, in the Humanities-Library Auditorium, Revelle College.

"Bile and Its Formation" will be his topic.

Dr. Wheeler joined the UCSD faculty in 1968, coming from Columbia University. A graduate of Harvard Medical School, he served his internship at Columbia University, his residency at the College of Physicians and Surgeons and served at Presbyterian Hospital in New York on a fellowship.

His research interests at UCSD include studies of liver and biliary tract physiology and studies of transport in the gallbladder. His research emphasis is currently on studies to delineate mechanisms of gall stone formation in experimental animals and ultimately in man. His major clinical interest is in liver disease.

Dr. Wheeler is on the editorial board of the Journal of Clinical Investigation and is a member of the American Physiological Society, the American Society for Clinical Investigation and the American Gastroenterological Association.

The lecture is free and open to the public.

The next PILS lecturer on April 24 will be Dr. Kurt E. Shuler, professor of chemistry, whose topic will be "Our Chemist in Washington."
