



Dr. York announces five recently-named professors will present their inaugural lectures during the coming months.

Five recently-named professors at the University of California, San Diego, will present their inaugural lectures during the coming months, Chancellor Herbert York announced today.

Initiated last year, the Professors' Inaugural Lecture Series serves as an introduction of new faculty members to the faculty, students, and staff of the campus. This year, they will be open to the public. All will be given in Sumner Auditorium on campus.

The lecturers are:

Milner B. Schaefer, appointed Professor of Oceanography and Director of the Institute of Marine Resources on August 1, will speak on "The Dynamics of Exploited Fish Populations" on Monday, November 19, at 4:15 p.m. One of the country's leading fisheries biologists, Schaefer headed the Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission before joining the University faculty and assuming the Directorship of the Institute of Marine Resources, which fosters investigations on such resources of the sea as the fisheries.

Andrew A. Benson, appointed Professor of Biology, will speak on "Nature's Surfactants: a Frontier in Biology," on Wednesday, January 9, at 4:15 p.m. Benson came to the San Diego campus from Pennsylvania State University. He received his B.S. degree from the Berkeley campus, his Ph.D., in organic chemistry, from CalTech.

Victor Vacquier, appointed Professor of Geophysics on July 1, will speak on Wednesday, February 27, at 4:15 p.m. His topic will be announced later. A member of the Scripps Institution of Oceanography staff since 1957, Vacquier has conducted pioneering studies in the magnetism of the earth. He has participated in several of Scripps' long expeditions in the Pacific.

Norman M. Kroll, appointed Professor of Physics on July 1, will speak on Wednesday, April 24, at 4:15 p.m. His topic will be announced later. Kroll's specialty is mathematical physics. He comes to San Diego from Columbia University, New York where he took his undergraduate and graduate training.

Norman Rostoker, appointed Professor of Physics on July 1, will speak on Wednesday, May 22, at 4:15 p.m. His topic will be announced later. Rostoker attended the University of Toronto and took his D.Sc. in solid-state physics, from Carnegie Institute of Technology. His interests include reactor theory and plasma physics. He was formerly a member of the staff of General Atomic.

In announcing the Series, Chancellor York said it was an example of the benefit to the campus and community that will result from the continued rapid growth of the campus.
