Under date of March 12, 1914, a permit was granted to you by the former State Water Commission to proceed to commence construction work to divert 50 cubic feet per second of the waters of Boulder Creek. Under the terms of this permit, actual construction work was to commence on or before July 15th, 1914 and proceed with due diligence.

Gentlemen:

Answering yours of June 14th, in reference to permit of Boulder Creek No. 1, will say that actual construction work was commenced immediately and has been continuous ever since. We have had from three to four men there on the job all the time.

We are under contract to sell all of our properties to the La Mesa, Lemon Grove and Spring Valley Irrigation District, and are simply awaiting the decision of the State Railroad Commission as to the value. There is a clause in the contract that no new work shall be commenced without the districts consent. Therefore, we have not started condemnation proceedings toward securing the rights of the Boulder Creek Mining Co. We expect a decision from the State Railroad Commission within the next thirty days.

In the matter of the character and extent of the work which we have done, the following is a correct statement:

We have built approximately 1500 feet of conduit with a section of two feet on the bottom and between two and three feet deep.

A preliminary excavation of the damsite has been commenced.

The total expenditure for actual excavation up to June 1, 1915 is *in excess of 3900.00*

In addition, we have made complete surveys and acquired rights of way from the U. S. Government.

We shall continue doing continuous work on this project until the system is taken over by the district.

You are probably aware, however, that the City of San Diego has intervened and has started proceedings to concern our entire system, including the taking over of the Boulder Creek project. There may be litigation in this matter, but we sincerely hope a satisfactory compromise can be effected.

Gentlemen:-

As perhaps you are aware the Cuyamaca Water Co. is under a contract to sell to the La Mesa, Lemon Grove and Spring Valley Irrigation District.

On March 12, 1914 the Cuyamaca Water Company received the Water Commission's Permit No. 1 on Boulder Creek and in accordance with law began construction upon the canal and dam site. This work has been prosecuted steadily to date and this construction and the application forms part of the property to be transferred to the Irrigation District.

As was explained verbally to your Chief Engineer, Mr. Davis, the immediate location of the power canal is not at the most favorable reservoir site and it was the intention of the Cuyamaca Water Co. to refile with the Forest Service and ask for the reservoir site one-half mile below the present intake location. For reasons connected with the sale, this has not been done and can not very well be carried out without the consent of the District. You will understand if later after the transfer has taken place this change of intake is applied for, the present expenditure is of only slight utility.

We therefore request the permission of the Water Commission to discontinue work upon this application until January 1, 1916, a date when the transfer to the District must be legally consummated.

The Cuyamaca Water Company have had their Chief Engineer prepare the necessary papers for filing with the Forest Service for this change of right of way, but a certain amount of time is required for the District to acquaint themselves with the particular situation on Boulder Creek where progress is hampered by certain mining claims and this procedure is necessary to either condemnation or a writ of ejectment.

Dear Sir:

This office is in receipt of your letter of August 18th requesting "the permission of the Water Commission to discontinue work upon this application (Boulder Creek#1) until January 1, 1916, a date when the transfer to the District must be legally consummated."

Section 10 of the water power act of January 2, 1912, under which your application was granted, provides (regarding the prosecution of construction work with reasonable diligence) that "if such work is not so commenced and prosecuted, the water commission may revoke its approval of the application."

Although this office can issue no order authorizing the discontinuance of work, it can and does assure you that under the existing circumstances it will not consider a discontinuance of work until January 1, 1916, as sufficient ground for a revocation of your permit.

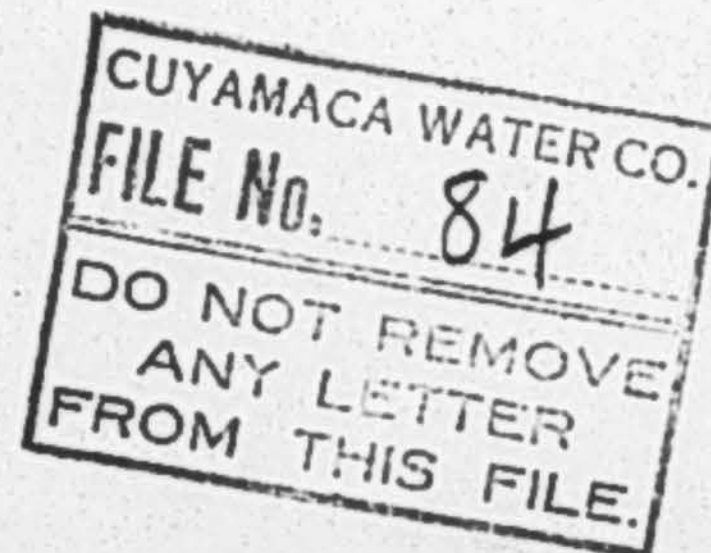

Dear Sirs:

Reference is made to the application of La Mesa, Lemon
Grove and Spring Valley Irrigation District pending before your
Commission, under Section 12 of the Water Commission Act.

In behalf of Cuyamaca Water Company, I wish to hereby
notify your Commission that, when this Company obtained the system
of the San Diego Flume Company in 1910, it caused appropriations to
be made on the San Diego River covering all of the normal and flood
flows of the stream which it is economically practical to utilize,
and that it has since been continuously developing its system under
a systematic plan which will utilize all of this flow, and has
thereby maintained its water rights in accordance with the State
Law.

At a recent hearing before the Local Land Office at
Los Angeles in the matter of the application of the City of San
Diego, assignee of W. B. Hamilton, for a reservoir site, Cuyamaca
Water Company introduced as its Exhibit "A" a table prepared by
Charles H. Lee, Consulting Hydraulic Engineer of Los Angeles, show-
ing the amount of water which would have been utilized during the
past 23 years by Cuyamaca Water Company's system if fully developed,
with allowance for riparian owners. The same Exhibit also shows
the waste over and above the water which would have been so utilized

same being shown in the 4th column of said Exhibit and entitled: "Waste from El Capitan Reservoir in excess of riparian demands". A copy of this Exhibit is attached hereto for your information.

Cuyamaca Water Company has no objection to La Mesa, Lemon Grove and Spring Valley Irrigation District's claiming any surplus waters over those which will be utilized by the former's completed system, but I am of the opinion that the amount of such surplus water will not be sufficient to warrant the construction of the District's proposed system.

I appreciate that the present determination by the State Water Commission of California is only one to determine whether or not La Mesa, Lemon Grove and Spring Valley Irrigation District has used reasonable diligence in carrying on the work necessary to put the water covered by its appropriations to a beneficial use. Cuyamaca Water Company will be glad to have the State Water Commission determine this question from its own investigations, as the District's activities to date have been largely those of organization, purchase of land, issuance of bonds, the securing of engineering reports and other like activities, the total extent of which may be more apparent to the Commission than to Cuyamaca Water Company.

In answer to your inquiry as to estimated expenditures, during each six months' period, since appropriation of the Lake Hodges water was made, will say that Wm. G. Henshaw, for whom the original filing was made, spent approximately \$25,000 during each six months' period, for lands, water rights, surveys, core drillings, etc. in connection with the project, and since the San Dieguito Mutual Water Company was formed, the said San Dieguito Mutual Water Company spent at least \$50,000 during each six months' period, during course of construction.

The cost of the present water system to the San Dieguito Mutual Water Company, and its distributing lines, including lands within the reservoir site and water rights, is approximately \$1,500,000.00.

Gentlemen:

Referring to your letter of September 6, 1921, in re Applications Nos. 2188 and 12-2315, Permit No. 905, will say that the Santa Fe Land Improvement Company is the largest stockholder in the San Dieguito Mutual Water Company; that they have made a contract with Henshaw & Fletcher for 10 years, for the sale of a million gallons of water a day, surplus water, for the first year of the contract, and two million gallons of water daily thereafter as a minimum, with a maximum of three million gallons daily; that this company has spent during the year 1921 the sum of \$20,759.33 in finishing the Del Mar-La Jolla pipe line, in building laterals and surveying for additional distributing lines. The pipe line, to carry this water, is now complete, and the Santa Fe Land Improvement Company is furnishing surplus water to the city thru Henshaw & Fletcher.

The stockholders of the San Diego Mutual Water Company are also directly or indirectly large land owners under the system. Five hundred acres have been irrigated during the year 1921, and 3,000 or 4,000 acres of land have been leveled and cleared, preparatory to applying the water thereto from Lake Hodges.

An irrigation district has been organized between Cardiff and Encinitas, comprising between 3,000 and 4,000 acres, and by some method water will be furnished this district from the Lake Hodges system, when it is legally organized and ready to negotiate for water. We hope during the year to add several thousand acres of land to the irrigated section under the Lake Hodges system.

We have had the heaviest rains in the history of San Diego, and there has been much flood damage which will have to be repaired. The estimated cost is \$15,000 to \$20,000. Part of the work of repair is already completed.
