

Pianist Sidney Foster, featured performer in the final chamber orchestra concert presented by the Summer Chamber Music Institute of UCSD

Pianist Sidney Foster will be the featured performer in the final chamber orchestra concert presented by the Summer Chamber Music Institute of the University of California, San Diego Thursday, Aug. 16.

The concert, titled "Summer of '73," will be held at 8:30 p.m. in Sherwood Hall, 700 Prospect St., La Jolla.

The program is the last in a series of three concerts this summer under the direction of noted violinist Rafael Druian, concertmaster of the New York Philharmonic.

Foster, who has performed with major orchestras throughout the United States, will play Mozart's "Concerto in D Major," also known as the "Coronation Concerto."

Other works in the program will include "Concertino in E flat" by Pergolesi, "Symphony No. 8 in G Major" by Haydn, "The Unanswered Question" by Ives and "Concerto Grosso for Piano and Strings" by Bloch.

The concert is a reunion for Druian and Foster who were classmates at the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia.

Foster was the first winner of the Leventritt Award in 1941 and made his debut at that time with the New York Philharmonic.

Sponsors of the concert are the UCSD Department of Music, the Friends of Chamber Music and UCSD's Summer Session.

Tickets are \$3.50 and may be purchased through the UCSD Department of Music or at The Turntable in La Jolla.

The chamber orchestra includes local artists and musicians from various parts of the country who are enrolled in the Summer Session Chamber Music Institute, a four-week workshop in chamber music performance.
