

"Educational Patterns in UCSD" conference sponsored by Revelle College

December 3, 1965

Some 175 high school counselors and advisors of the San Diego city, county and private schools are expected to attend a conference on the "Educational Patterns in UCSD" Saturday, December 11, sponsored by Revelle College, the first of the 12 interrelated colleges which will eventually comprise the University of California, San Diego.

The morning conference, to which all high school counselors and advisors in the area are invited, will begin at 9:30 a.m. in the new Humanities-Library Auditorium located on the southern boundary of the Revelle College campus. The session will conclude about 1:30 p.m. following a luncheon sponsored by Revelle College in the new Central Facilities Building. The building, scheduled to open later this year for student use, will provide a cafeteria, a bookstore, meeting rooms and other services to Revelle College students.

The counselors and advisors will hear from several speakers including Dr. Edward Goldberg, Provost of Revelle College, and Miss Mary Avery, Assistant to Dr. Goldberg, who will discuss the Revelle College educational philosophy and its resulting curriculum. Particular emphasis will be given to the problem of identifying the kind of students most likely to succeed in the UCSD program. Although admission requirements are identical on all campuses of the University of California, certain special programs seem to be ideally suited to certain types of students.

Dr. John Stewart, Provost of The Second College, will discuss the somewhat different program which will become available in the fall of 1967 when The Second College begins its academic schedule.

An opportunity will be provided for questions and discussion from the visiting counselors and advisors. Mr. Sam Hinton, Assistant Director of the Universitywide Office of Relations with Schools, will be available to assist in relating the discussion to other campuses.
