

Central University Library Book Sale

April 23, 1984

Between 1,500 and 2,000 books will be on sale from noon to 2 p.m. Friday, May 11 in the annual Friends of the UCSD Library book sale at the University of California, San Diego.

The sale, which is open to the public, will be held in the main lobby of the Central University Library. The library is located north of the UCSD administrative complex near the Third College campus.

According to Laurence McGilvery who, with his wife Geraldine, has been in charge of the annual sale for the past eight years, there will be an excellent assortment of books with a better than usual collection of history material this year.

"The university has received several large history collections in the past year," McGilvery said. "Many of the books that will be on sale are duplicates of those already in the university collection."

McGilvery said many of the books will be sold for under \$1. The Friends of the UCSD Library, a group of campus and community people who work in support of the library and its various collections, was formed in 1963.
