

Two firsts noted in orientation and registration week

Two important firsts will be noted Sunday, September 24, when nearly 3,000 students begin orientation and registration activities on the campus of the University of California, San Diego.

For the first time a full class of seniors will be entering Revelle College. They are the remaining members of the original freshmen class, which entered Revelle in the fall of 1964 as the school's first undergraduates. About 100 of the original class of 181 are expected to enroll this fall.

Also, for the first time, John Muir College, the second of 12 colleges, will accept its first students for its first academic year.

About 500 freshmen and 120 new advanced standing students are expected to enter Revelle College this fall along with 300 new graduate students. They will join the 1,750 graduate and undergraduate returning students.

Muir College expects an entering freshmen class of 350 students plus about 30 advanced standing students. Several of the advanced standing students began their work in Revelle and are now transferring to Muir.

Students will begin moving into the dormitories on both campuses at 8:00 a.m., Sunday. Two new dormitories on the Revelle College campus, housing more than 400 students, will be open for the first time this fall, completing the major construction for that campus.

Revelle College will officially greet its new students and their parents at convocation ceremonies beginning at 2:00 p.m., Sunday in Urey Hall Plaza. UCSD Chancellor John S. Galbraith will welcome the students and Revelle Provost Paul Saltman and Revelle College Dean Thorias Hull will outline the academic goals of the University.

The Muir College meeting for students and parents will begin at 2:30 p.m., Sunday in the residence halls quadrangle on Matthews Campus. Chancellor Galbraith, Muir College Provost John L. Stewart and other members of the Muir College staff will welcome the students.

Students in both colleges will begin their processing on Monday morning with a series of mathematics placement tests, language proficiency examinations and English Subject A examinations.

Revelle College students will have dinner with faculty members in the cafeteria and at 7:30 p.m., attend a lecture by psychologist Abraham Maslow of Brandeis University. Muir College students will attend a lecture at 2:45 p.m. by Dr. Nevitt Sanford, distinguished author and scholar. That evening the new students will meet at the homes of their advisors for dinner.

On Tuesday and Wednesday, there will be more testing, intramural competition, and a fashion show and tea for the women of both colleges. A joint John Muir-Revelle College dance is scheduled for Wednesday evening.

A bus trip to the San Diego Zoo, sports, a concert by the Lee Schipper Jazz Quintet, medical examinations and class registration will take up most of Thursday and Friday. An informal dance for all students, sponsored

by Sigma Tau Epsilon service fraternity, will be held at 10:00 p.m., Friday, in the South Dining Hall of Revelle Commons.

The two colleges will play off for the intramural football and volleyball championships on Saturday and all students will attend a beach party, barbecue, and dance beginning at 4:00 p.m. on the Scripps beach. On Sunday the Revelle College freshmen will battle the faculty in a softball game at 1:00 p.m. and will present dormitory skits in the Revelle Cafeteria at 7:00 p.m. Muir College students will attend a picnic dinner in the Matthews Campus Quadrangle at 4:00 p.m.

Classes for both colleges begin at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, October 2.
