

Harold Temmer to become president of AACRAO

Harold E. Temmer, Registrar and Admissions Officer at the University of California, San Diego, will be installed as President of the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (AACRAO) at the Association's 55th annual meeting April 21 through 24 in Dallas, Texas.

Temmer has served as President-Elect of the 4,800 member association for the past year and is only the third Admissions Officer from a west coast school to hold the post of president since the association's founding in 1910. J. P. Mitchell of Stanford University was president in 1931 and Herman A. Spindt of the University of California was president in 1959.

Temmer will be installed during the annual banquet in the Grand Ballroom of the Statler-Hilton Hotel, Thursday, April 24.

The four-day meeting will bring together representatives of 1,600 institutions from throughout the United States. The program will include a series of information exchanges, professional presentations and workshops all dealing with the working problems faced by registrar and admission officers.

Of special interest this year will be several workshops dealing with the use of computers by colleges and universities for registration of students. Ronald J. Bowker, Associate Registrar and Admissions Officer at UCSD, is scheduled to read a paper on "Optical Scanner Card Admissions Input" during a workshop on Tuesday, April 22.

Temmer received a B.S. and an M.S. in mathematics from the University of Illinois. He has taught at Biarritz American University in France and at the University of Illinois. He is a member of the Pacific Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers and past president of the Illinois Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers. He has also served as vice president for professional activities in the AACRAO.
