Dear Sir:

Your letter dated Sept. 17th, 1918, addressed to our attorney, C. C. Crouch, has been referred to this Office. As per your request we are enclosing herewith our bill for \$32.00, being for water furnished from June 1st, 1917, to Sept. 30th, 1918, at a minimum charge of \$2.00 per month, and we trust to receive your check by return mail.

In future bills for water used must be paid not later than the 10th day of the month following, otherwise a penalty of 25 ¢ will be added. Bills will be mailed you hereafter, commencing from October 1st, 1918, which will be due and payable at this office the 1st of November; the enclosed bill includes water up to the 1st of October.

Gentlemen:-
Your letter and bill of Sept. 24th. is received. In my last letter to you I neglected to state that during the summer vacation, from June 15th. to Sept. 1st, I was not here to use any water. We spent both summers in Long Beach and no one was in the house during that time. There was also a period each year in the winter that the water was shut off for the repair of the flume. This makes another five or six weeks that I did not use your water. As I use but very little water at any time during the year, I feel that you ought to make some adjustment on the time that I did not use any at all. Kindly consider the matter and I trust that you will see fit to allow me some adjustment.

Dear Sir:-

Your letter of September 25th, 1918, to hand, regarding bill for water mailed you amounting to \$32.00.

In reply beg to say that we are somewhat surprised at the contents of your letter. In the first place, you have been using water at any and all times without first making application to this Company. Again, you have never ordered the water turned off during the period when you claim you were away. Accordingly there was no other alternative for us but to make you a bill for the minimum charge of \$2.00 a month, which we have done and which we consider is a proper charge. Accordingly, we will have to ask you to send us your check for the amount of the bill rendered.

Any time you expect to be away for any length of time, if you will mail us a postcard or telephone this office to shut off the water, no charges will be made during the period the water is off or for turning on the water again so long as there are no bills unpaid. If the water is allowed to be on, whether it is used or not, a minimum charge of \$2.00 a month is made.

In view of the manner that you have been using water without first complying with the rules of this Company, it will be impossible for us to make any allowances in the bill rendered and we trust you will send your check by return mail.
