### Marsh, Lewis and Sasway address Revelle Plaza rally

An estimated 400 people heard Michael Marsh, Norm Lewis and Ben Sasway address a rally sponsored by the Committee Against Registration for the Draft held in Revelle Plaza last Tuesday,

All three speakers enjoyed an enthusiastic reception, and although the general atmosphere of the rally was relaxed and friendly, a slight note of paranoia crept in when one veteran of the Sixties rallies noted, "There were a lot of photographers taking pictures of the crowd.'

Marsh is a Warren College senior who has publicly declared his refusal to register for the draft; Lewis is a Vietnam veteran who supports this position; and Sasway is a student from Poway who was the first and, so far, the only registration resister to spend time in jail for his stand.

Marsh and Sasway are two of nearly 470,000 who have neglected to comply with the draft registration law initiated by Jimmy Carter in 1980, along with the Olympic boycott and the restriction of grain sales, as part of his response to the Russians' invasion of Afghanistan. To date, nearly nine million have registered with the Selective Service.

Marsh said that he has notified President Reagan and the Selective Service about his resolve not to register, but, "So far," he said, "They have shown no interest in me.

Just last week, the charges brought against another California non-registrant, David Alan Wayte, 21, were dismissed by Federal Judge Terry Hatter in Los Angeles. in part because, as the judge ruled, the government was prosecuting only those who openly and publicly refused to register.

Sasway, whose noncompliance generated much publicity, served 40 days of the 30 months he was sentenced to serve in a minimum-security. camp-like facility. Judge Gordon Thompson Jr. found Sasway guilty of refusing to register with the Selective Service under a presidential

Each speaker cast Ronald Reagan and "the government" stressed the importance of thinking for oneself. Marsh and Lewis concentrated on a "we-versus-they" strategy while Sasway discussed the controversy in a more personal

Marsh spoke first, describing draft registration as, "A courier the government is using to collect our feelings concerning a possible

said Marsh, "we show the our will... They better be more responsive to peoples' needs,

Marsh encouraged people to 'speak out, join a group to stand up for your rights. Stand up and be heard!" He explained that. "After you register, you're just a name on a list in the Pentagon's hands...another patriotic American willing to give up fight for the American way in Asia or South America, or

after serving in Vietnam for one year, spoke next. He began for the draft...We are telling consequences of registering for the draft."

Lewis also strove to activate the crowd when he said, "I tell you people, you better wake up. Those people in high places don't give a damn about you.

When Lewis finished Sasway began by declaring, "For the record, I am not doing

### Faculty salaries are static

For 1983-84, faculty salaries at the University of California are projected to lag 16.5 percent behind salaries paid at comparable universities unless there is a general salary increase.

No cost-of-living increase was provided for UC faculty or other state employees in 1982-83, and an increase for faculty next year has been identified by UC President David S. Saxon as the university's highest priority.

In discussing the matter with UC Regents at their meeting Thursday, Nov. 18 in San Francisco, Saxon pointed out that in three other recent years, all during the decade of the 1970s, no general increase was provided by the state for faculty salaries, and that in another year a flat dollar increase rather than a percentage was granted.

Saxon is asking Regents to authorize him to develop an appropriate salary proposal for faculty based on this analysis and on additional relevant information.

The eight institutions included in UC's annual comparison survey are Cornell University, Harvard University, the University of Illinois, the University of Michigan, Stanford University, the University of Wisconsin, Yale University and the State University of New York at

Funds needed for each one percent increase in faculty salaries amount to \$5,309,446.

# Alderson Chair: yes

The establishment of the Victor C. Alderson Chair of Applied Ocean Science in the Division of Engineering at UCSD has been approved by the University's Board of

The endowed chair, funded by a \$250,000 gift from two anonymous donors, is the sixth such chair established on the UCSD campus. Income from the endowment will go to support the teaching and research of a UCSD faculty member who is actively engaged in applied ocean science research. Applied ocean science covers a broad range of topics including oceanic remote sensing, signal processing, materials science. control systems, computer engineering and electronic instrumentation.

The appointment of the holder of the Alderson Chair of Applied Ocean Science is expected to be made during the current 1982-83 academic year.

In acknowledging the acceptance of the Victor C. Alderson Chair, UCSD Chancellor Richard C. Atkinson said that he was pleased that the campus now has six endowed chairs with two of them in the newly formed Division of Engin-

"The generous gift of the chair will strengthen our ability to recruit outstanding faculty in one of the original components of our engineering and applied sciences program, Atkinson said.






