EDITORS NOTE

There have recently been a number of honors and awards given to UCSD staff and faculty members. In addition, several faculty members have been elected to positions such as chairman-elect or president-elect of various academic organizations. In an effort to cut down on the flow of paper, we have combined a number of these into a single report for your use now or for reference in the future.

Dr. David Phillips, associate professor of sociology, has been named to receive the Shneidman Award by the American Association of Suicidology. The award is named for Ed Shneidman, a pioneer researcher in the field of suicidology and is offered to workers in the field under the age of 40 as a sign of the Association's appreciation of their career commitment to the study of suicide and of their actual achievements as well as potential future achievements.

Bertram Turetzky, professor of music, has been selected as a recipient of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers Award for 1982-83. Turetzky has established a reputation as an outstanding virtuoso performer and as the most recorded contrabass soloist in America. The ASCAP awards are given by an independent panel of music educators, directors and performers to assist and encourage writers of serious music.

Harvey Campbell, manager of telecommunications services, has been awarded the Gene Pesavento Memorial Award by the Tele-communications Association (TCA). The award is presented annually "to the member making the greatest contribution toward the advancement of TCA and its objectives."

Dr. John Miles, professor of applied mechanics and geophysics and vice chancellor, academic affairs, has been selected as the 1983 Otto LaPorte lecturer by the Division of Fluid Dynamics of the American Physical Society.

John W. Cates, supervisor in the Department of Physical Education, has been elected to serve on the Southwest District Board of Directors of the American Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance in the capacity of Recreation Chair Elect.

Dr. Fred Davis, professor of sociology, has been elected president of the Society for the Study of Symbolic Interaction for 1983-84.

Three artists on the UCSD faculty have been awarded grants from the National Endowment for the Arts. Louis Hock, assistant professor of visual arts, has been awarded a Public Media Grant for \$12,000 to work on non-traditional film presentation in public spaces. Fred Lonidier, associate professor of art, received a photography grant of \$5,000 for his work which deals with the sociological possibilities of photography applied to social change. -Philip Steinmetz, associate professor of art, was awarded a \$5,000 photography grant for his photo/text project about the psychological and physiological meanings of the idea of "community" in Southern California.
