

Seventh annual Music-Go-Round home tour to be held in La Jolla

January 3, 1974

The seventh annual Music-Go-Round home tour highlighting the arts will be held from 2 to 5 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 10, in La Jolla.

Sponsored by the La Jolla Civic/University Symphony and Chorus, the event will feature four homes chosen for their architecture, landscaping and art collections.

The 1974 tour, which coincides with the symphony's 20th anniversary year, will also include a variety of musical entertainment in each home performed by members of the symphony and chorus.

Among the homes on the tour will be the Harry W. Crosby residence at 6996 Via Valverde. The owners designed the three-year-old home copying a Spanish colonial design from the Mexican state of Michoacan. Tile and carved stone are used extensively throughout the interior and exterior of the home. Paintings by members of the Crosby family are displayed in the home.

A second home on the tour is a contemporary wood and glass structure at 2545 Ardath Rd. Owned by Mrs. Danah Fayman, the house contains a representative collection of modern art beginning with the Impressionists.

Landscape architect Joseph Yamada's residence at 1676 El Camino del Teatro will also be open to the public. The multi-level, modern home has an oriental emphasis utilizing cedar and features a collection of works by Japanese and Chinese artists.

Also on display will be the home of Rex Ryan at 1716 El Camino del Teatro. The contemporary ranch house contains a large collection of abstract paintings by local artist Ralph Costantino of La Costa.

Hospitality house for the afternoon will be the Donald Hazelton home at 1545 La Cumbre where a mariachi band will entertain and refreshments will be served.

Proceeds from the tour will provide scholarships for musicians in the symphony and will help support the symphony's Youth Talent Competition which furnishes cash awards to gifted young musicians.

Chairman of the event is Mrs. Augusto Angelucci of La Jolla. Thomas Nee, symphony musical director, is coordinating plans for the entertainment which will include chamber, choral and folk music. Mrs. Martin N. Chamberlain of La Jolla is in charge of hostesses.
