Dear Mr. Strange:

Your strange request has my ears up. Having always held that science is the art form of the 20th century, I am delighted to learn that science can feed back to the arts.

Fortuitously, about a year ago I put together a short tape of selected fish and environmental signals, along with a brief running commentary that tells our story. I warn that the background levels are quite high, and that the tape was simply dubed in our lab and not under studio conditions. It will save you a great deal of time, however, and at any rate I would not let the original tapes out of my lab. I hope it will suffice for your purposes. Necessary information is marked on the box. Please return it when you are through taking what you want from it.

We would be interested to learn of your reactions and the final out-come. When you get around to recording these types of signals, two bits of advise. Begin your work on fish signals with the electric eel (Electrophorus electricus L.), obtainable from tropical fish dealers. Their so-called "organ of Sachs" produce a fasinating series of relatively weak electric signals in synchronization with their rate of movement that sounds like an outboard motor starting up. (Visit the Steinhart aquarium in San Francisco for a prevue.) Do your field recording as far from civilization, power lines, radio transmitters, etc. as possible. A desert or mountain lake might be ideal.

I'm sure my co'authors join with me in thanking you for your interest in our work.
