

## Vietnamese writer Tran Van Dinh to lecture on "Communications in Wars of **National Liberation**"

Vietnamese writer Tran Van Dinh will lecture at the University of California, San Diego Wednesday, May 15, on "Communications in Wars of National Liberation."

Van Dinh will speak at 8 p.m. in Room 2250 of the Humanities & Social Sciences Building on Muir campus.

The talk is the fifth and final program in the Third College Communications Lecture Series, "Communications, Ideology and Technology- The Current Crisis."

Born in Hue, Van Dinh was a member of the Vietnam Liberation Army in the first Indochina war following World War II. He joined the South Vietnam Foreign Service in 1954, serving in Thailand, Burma, Argentina and the United States.

Since 1964, Van Dinh has been a journalist and lecturer. He has taught at the State University of New York, Dag Hammarskjold College in Columbia, Md., and is currently teaching at Temple University.

Van Dinh is author of "No Passenger on the River," an anti-war novel, and co-author of "Australia and the Asian Revolution," "Why We Are Still in Vietnam," "Laos: War and Revolution" and "We, the Vietnamese." He has also written articles for The Washington Post, The New York Times, The Christian Science Monitor, New Republic and The Nation.
