

Organist Lawrence Moe to present concert

Lawrence Moe, University Organist for the University of California, will present a concert at 8:00 p.m., on Monday, February 3, at the La Jolla Presbyterian Church, 7715 Draper, La Jolla.

Moe is being presented by the Committee for Arts and Lectures of the San Diego campus of the University.

Moe holds Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music degrees from Northwestern University and M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from Harvard University. He was awarded a Fulbright research grant to Italy in 1952 for the study of Italian Renaissance dance and dance music.

While in Rome on a post-doctoral Fulbright grant in 1963, he served as organist of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in that city.

Moe now serves as chairman of the Department of Music and professor of music on the Berkeley campus of the University. He has played numerous recitals throughout the United States and Europe.

The program for the concert will include: Sonata No. 1 (1937) by Hindemith; Prelude in D minor, Chaconne in F minor and "From Heaven Above" by Pachelbel; Solemn Mass for Use in the Parishes by F. Couperin; and Trio Sonata No. 3 in D minor by J. S. Bach.

The concert, co-sponsored with the Intercampus Cultural Exchange Committee of the University of California and the San Diego Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, will be free and open to the public.
