

An invitation to high school English teachers on lectures given by Regents' Lecturer David Ignatow

The distinguished American poet David Ignatow will be a Regents' Lecturer in the Department of Literature at the University of California, San Diego from Nov. 17-22, to celebrate the acquisition of his papers and manuscripts by the university.

The acquisition will be on display on the second and eighth floors of the Central University Library during the month of November. The Ignatow Collection was purchased by the Archive for New Poetry, located in the Mandeville Department of Special Collections, on the eighth floor of the library.

Ignatow will give a lecture on "William Carlos Williams and Wallace Stevens: Two of a Kind," in the UCSD Students' Center North Conference Room, at 4 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 18.

A poetry reading will take place at 4:30 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 19, in the Center for Music Experiment, Matthews Administrative and Academic Complex, sponsored by the Archive for New Poetry's New Writing Series.

At 4 p.m., Thursday, Nov. 20, Ignatow will give a lecture, "Open Forum on the Nature of Art and Poetry," in the North Conference Room of the Student Center.
