of Governor Riley, and this
time-hallowed, sacred New-
England festival was observed
in various sections of California,

erable fervor. It is the first
appointment of a general day
of Thanksgiving which has
been officially made since the
occupation of the country by
Americans, although two years
ago in this City (San Francisco)
the sons of New-England met in
happy commemoration of
their beloved custom, but
altogether from the natural
impulses which the day inspires.
