Our speaker, Mick Rabin, is the Project Resource Teacher for LGBTQIA Advocacy in the San Diego

"RAISING ZOEY"

On **April 26** from 6:00-8:30 pm, the San Diego Central Library presents "Raising Zoey," the coming-of-age story of a transgender teen on a journey to find her voice — as a daughter, sister, student and activist. The film covers topics pertaining to growing up trans in a working-class Latino home, and the intersectionality of the family addresses subjects like immigration, early transitioning, knowing your rights at school as a trans/gender non-conforming student, navigating medical insurance, community support, early medical support, suicide prevention, empowerment, and peer to peer advocacy. Following a screening of the 50-minute documentary, there will be Q&A time with Ofelia Barba and Zoey Luna, as well as filmmaker Dante Alencastre. PFLAG will have a table to distribute literature.

The library is located at 330 Park Blvd., downtown San Diego, and the screening is in the Shiley Special Events Suite, 9th Floor. There is free parking validation for 2 hours. The parking garage is located beneath the library. There is also free meter parking beginning at 6:00 pm.

LGBT COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP COUNCIL STANDS TALL

The Community Leadership Council commits to last year's resolution protesting the exclusion of Transgender service members from military service. PFLAG San Diego County will again stand with the community against the ban. Here is the Resolution:

The United States Department of Defense Exclusion of Transgender Persons from Military Service April 26, 2018

Whereas the mission of the San Diego LGBT Community Leadership Council, a project of The San Diego LGBT Community Center, is to support and enhance the business, political, cultural, and community life of the San Diego LGBT community, improve the health and well-being of its members, and advance the equality and civil rights of all by providing a stable, effective, and on-going collaborative mechanism through which LGBT community organizations and their allies can effectively exchange information, coordinate community activities, collaborate on community projects, and provide coordinated community leadership,

Whereas, On March 23, 2018, The President of the United States, Donald J. Trump, announced a Department of Defense policy that excludes transgender persons from military service based on their gender identity, except under certain limited circumstances; and

Whereas, The American Medical Association stated that there "is no medically valid reason — including a diagnosis of gender dysphoria — to exclude transgender individuals from military service"; and

Whereas, The American Psychological Association finds "substantial psychological research shows that gender dysphoria is a treatable condition, and does not, by itself, limit the ability of individuals to function well and excel in their work, including in military service"; and

Whereas, No scientific research has shown that transgender servicemembers adversely impact readiness or unit cohesion, but research does show that discrimination and stigma harms morale and readiness by creating stress for transgender persons that harms their well-being; and

Whereas, The American Psychiatric Association has also voiced strong opposition to banning transgender persons from military service; and

Whereas, This policy will result in the loss of potential and current fully trained and deployable military personnel bases solely on their gender identity; and

Whereas, Transgender individuals, including those from San Diego, have served, and continue to serve, our country with honor, and should be allowed to continue doing so; now, therefore, be it

Resolved that the San Diego LGBT Community Leadership Council finds the exclusion of transgender persons from United States military service unfair, discriminatory and unconstitutional.

CHEERS FOR LORI LIGHTFOOT

In early April, Lori Lightfoot won a resounding victory (i.e., landslide) to become both the first African American woman and openly gay person elected mayor of Chicago, dealing a stinging defeat to a political establishment that has reigned over City Hall for decades.

Lightfoot's win makes Chicago the largest U.S. city ever to elect an openly gay mayor.

"A lot of little boys and girls are out there watching us tonight, and they're seeing the beginning of something, well, a little bit different," Lightfoot said with a smile. "They're seeing a city reborn, a city where it doesn't matter what color you are, where it surely doesn't matter how tall you are and where it doesn't matter who you love, just as long as you love with all your heart."

It's heartwarming to hear of Ms Lightfoot's improbable journey, from the diminutive daughter of poor parents who worked multiple low-wage jobs in the segregated steel town of Massillon, Ohio, to graduate of University of Michigan and the University of Chicago law school, to federal prosecutor, major law firm partner and now mayor of America's third-largest city.

"My parents didn't have much money, but they had their dignity and their dreams, dreams for their children, dreams for me," Lightfoot said. "They taught me the value of honesty, decency, hard work and education, and they gave me faith, the faith that put me where I am today."

THIS IS 2019??

In the small southeast Asian kingdom of Brunei, a new law that went into effect early April, will punish homosexual sex and adultery with death by stoning, should they be found guilty. What are the odds they won't be found guilty?

Human rights groups were quick to express horror at the penal code, which will also order amputation as a punishment for theft.

"Brunei must immediately halt its plans to implement these vicious punishments, and revise its Penal Code in compliance with its human rights obligations. The international community must urgently condemn Brunei's move to put these cruel penalties into practice," Rachel Chhoa-Howard, Brunei Researcher at Amnesty International, said in a statement.

With more international pressure, the small nation said it has no plans to halt the law.

Actor George Clooney called for a boycott of the nine hotels linked to Brunei -- three of which are in the UK, two in the US, two in France, and two in Italy. They include the Beverly Hills Hotel and the Bel-Air in Los Angeles. "Are we really going to help pay for these human rights violations? Are we really going to help fund the murder of innocent citizens?" he wrote.

World leaders have followed in denouncing the country's harsh practices and stood by the LGBT community.

The United Nations has condemned the law, saying that human rights experts have "expressed their concerns about the cruel, inhuman and degrading punishments contained in the penal code order."

"I appeal to the government to stop the entry into force of

this draconian new penal code, which would mark a serious setback for human rights protections for the people of Brunei if implemented," wrote Michelle Bachelet, the UN high commissioner for human rights, in a statement.

And the United States? They refused to condemn the law. After being asked for comment several times by The Daily Beast, the State Department issued a statement saying that the U.S. is "concerned" with the law and that the punishments "appear inconsistent with international human rights obligations, including with respect to torture or other cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment." But did they condemn it? NO! Their statement was a broad no torture statement without referring to the new Brunei Penal Code (Shariah Law). When pressed further about this specific law, a spokesperson said, "Governments have an obligation to ensure that all people, including LGBTI people, can freely enjoy the universal human rights and fundamental freedoms to which they are entitled. We strongly oppose human rights violations and abuses against LGBTI persons. including violence, the criminalization of LGBTI status or conduct, and serious forms of discrimination." Again, nothing specific to Brunei.

In celebrity circles, Perez Hilton has outed the Sultan of Brunei's son, Prince Azim. He is the fourth in line to the throne. Not to be catty, and you can take it for what it's worth, it is well known that the prince has lavish parties with queer celebrities among the guests. These parties have free-flowing alcohol which would be strike two for Prince Azim. His brother, Prince Jefri, is also reportedly "hedonistic" and adultery would be his fatal sin. Both men would be put to death under their father's law.

As part of the LGBTQ community, it is important for all of us to speak up.

JOHN MCCAIN WOULD NOT HAVE STOOD FOR THIS

Arizona has a law that bans schools from portraying "homosexuality as a positive alternative lifestyle" and from teaching safer sex methods for gay people.

In March, Equality Arizona and others sued Arizona Superintendent of Public Instruction Kathy Hoffman in federal court, arguing that the anti-LGBTQ curriculum law violates LGBTQ students' Fourteenth Amendment equal protection rights.

Now Arizona Attorney General Mark Brnovich says that he won't defend the law in court. Normally, the state attorney general represents state agencies in court.

Brnovich sent a letter to state House Speaker Rusty Bowers and state Senate President Karen Fann to inform them of his decision and to give them "adequate time and information to make an informed decision" about whether the state legislature will defend the law with its own attorneys.

The state attorney general's office said that the anti-LGBTQ curriculum law "is probably susceptible to being struck down by the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals," even if it could be defended in court. Thank heavens!

A spokesperson for Bowers said that the state house is more focused on repealing the law than defending it in court.

"Details are still being negotiated, but Speaker Bowers expects the Legislature to revise current law to address the issues raised in the lawsuit."

Fann said that she has not made a decision on whether to defend the law.

Madelaine Adelman, the founder of GLSEN Phoenix, an LGBTQ student organization, welcomed the attorney general's announcement.

"A clean repeal will move Arizona away from this decadesold stigma-based approach to education," she said in a statement. "Such legal reform is critical, given what is known about its effect on the safety and health of students in K-12 schools."

The suit also ties the law to bullying, saying that it sends a message "that there is something so undesirable, shameful, or controversial about 'homosexuality' that any positive portrayals of LGBTQ people or same-sex relationships must be explicitly barred."
