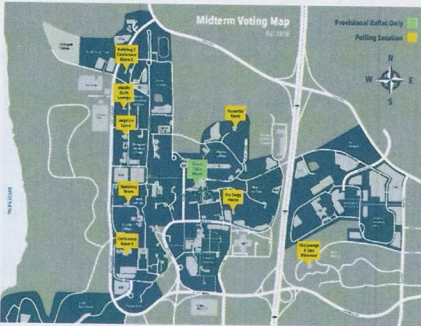

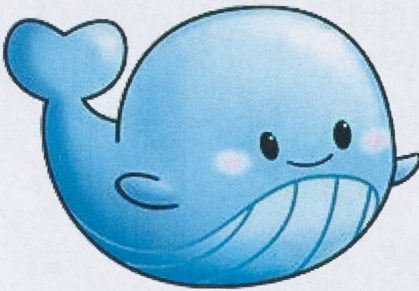


The November 6, 2018 General Election is approaching and UC San Diego encourages eligible students, faculty, and staff to exercise their voting rights.

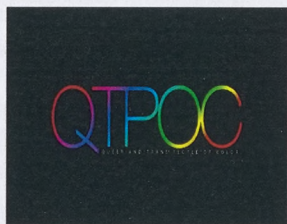

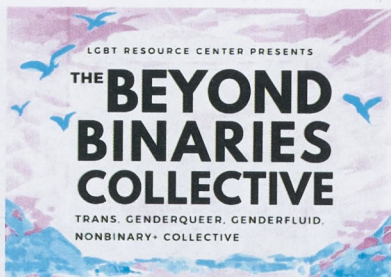

The San Diego Asian Film Festival will feature a movie called "Dear Ex", a drama/comedy that explores the life of Song Zhengyuan. He came out as gay to his wife, Liu Sanlian, and left his family to be with Jay, his partner. Only months afterwards, Zhengyuan passed away. Sanlian's anger reaches a breaking point when she discovers Jay is the sole beneficiary on her husband's life insurance policy and to get the money, she has to strike up a relationship with the man he was in love with. To complicate matters, her teenage son Chengxi, frustrated with the adults in his life, runs away from home and moves in with Jay, uninvited and unwanted, to learn more about the mysterious relationship his father had with this other man.

The movie will be shown free for UCSD students.



A person whose gender identity consists of two genders



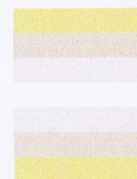

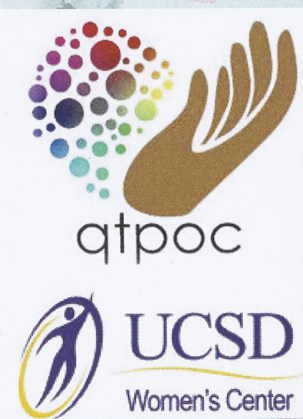

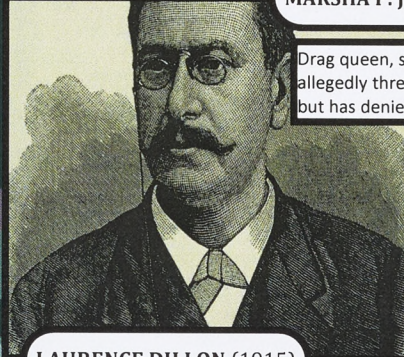

Trans Figures in History



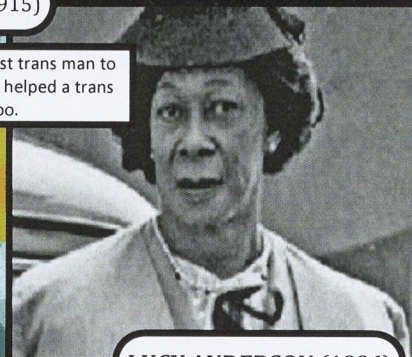
MARSHA P. JOHNSON (1942)

Drag queen, sex worker, & activist who allegedly threw the first brick at Stonewall but has denied the claims.



LAURENCE DILLON (1915)

Advocate, author, & the first trans man to undergo a phalloplasty. He helped a trans woman through surgery, too.



LUCY ANDERSON (1886)

Marriage equality activist who was jailed multiple times for fraud while seeking marriage benefits.



WE'WHA (1849)

A Zuni Native American from New Mexico most famous for their Ihamana (Two-Spirit) identity.

Genderfluid

Someone whose gender identity changes and/or fluctuates between two or more genders



Demigirl

A person whose gender identity is anywhere between the middle of the binary spectrum and the feminine end



Demiboy

A person whose gender identity is anywhere between the middle of the binary spectrum and the masculine end



Girlflux

A person whose gender identity fluctuates between the middle of the binary spectrum and the feminine end



Boyflux

A person whose gender identity fluctuates between the middle of the binary spectrum and the masculine end



Agender

A person who does not identify with having a gender identity
