With spring term underway and summer jobs of concern to career-conscious undergraduates, a number of special programs are being offered at the University of California, San Diego, by the Career Services Center. Many seniors, of course, are concerned about full time employment after graduation and they, too, have spring term offerings of job search programs.

One of your reporters may be interested in following up on one or all of these programs. Available for undergraduates:

Summer Job Fair, April 16. Amazingly, 40 employers have job openings and will have a representative at the job fair to meet students and discuss these openings.

Career Information Fair, May 15. This annual event hosts more than 80 professionals, many of them alumni, who give students information about their jobs. Then, advice in hand, students can use the summer to follow up.

Fellowship Outreach. The Professional and Graduate School Advising Program meets with outstanding juniors to give them the necessary information to prepare applications over the summer for prestigious national fellowships.

Available for seniors, in addition to on-going services such as on-campus interviews, workshops and job listings:

ACCESS. A new networking program for students interested in social sciences-oriented employment helps them look for these hard-to-find jobs.

Special Interviewing Weeks. This term the on-campus interviewing programs highlights employers from Biotech and Sales and Marketing.

Job Search Club. Students meet three times a week for three weeks and aggressively search for jobs, with advisory help, using phone banks and following leads.
