Tim Wise is among the most prominent anti-racist writers and activists in the U.S., and has been called, "One of the most brilliant, articulate and courageous critics of white privilege in the nation," by best-selling author and professor Michael Eric Dyson, of Georgetown University.

Wise is the author of five books: *White Like Me: Reflections on Race from a Privileged Son*; *Affirmative Action: Racial Preference in Black and White*; *Speaking Treason Fluently: Anti-Racist Reflections from an Angry White Male*; *Between Barack and a Hard Place: Racism and White Denial in the Age of Obama*, and his latest, *Colorblind: The Rise of Post-Racial Politics and the Retreat from Racial Equity*. He has contributed essays to twenty-five books, and is one of several persons featured in *White Men Challenging Racism: Thirty-Five Personal Stories*, from Duke University Press.
